#### Missionaries pre June 1840

Since getting involved in feminism in the 1970s I've taken a great interest in the place and fate of women, from my place and culture to Biblical Women and the Wives of Missionaries. I've lead U3A groups on these topics and compiled research findings to give a more inclusive picture of the lives of missionaries. Finding facts about women and children is not easy. Many hours spent in diligent pursuit does not guarantee this list is error free. I offer it as a comprehensive overview.

#### **Church Missionary Society (CMS)** Anglican

### Founding families - arrived Oihi, Bay of Islands 22 Dec 1814

('Pious artisans' recruited by Rev Samuel Marsden to model Christian living)

William & Dinah Hall + 3 yr old William and was pregnant; (had a girl, then another boy); daughter, Dinah Catherine, b. May 1915, was the 1st Pakeha girl born in NZ

Thomas & Jane Kendall + Thomas 7, Basil & Joseph 5, [2 girls at school in NSW] (9 chn In all) John & Hannah King + Philip aged 15 mths and was pregnant (12 chn.);

son, Thomas Holloway b. Feb 1815 1st European born in NZ; d. 1818 aged 3 Mrs Hannah Hansen & adult son Thomas Hansen Jr. (mth & brth of Hannah King) initially lived with them; Hannah's father, Thomas, captained Marsden's brig and later settled in NZ.

## Additional 'interest' information

**Luke Wade** arr NZ 1821(labourer for CMS) became a labourer for the WMS in 1823; returned to England 1827 to get his wife, who unknown to him was on her way to NZ.

Mrs Wade arr. 1827 at Wesleydale. Her health failed Luke took her to NSW, where she died soon after their arrival Oct 1829. (She is only referred to as 'Mrs Wade' I can find no child records for these Wades; Rev William Richard & Sarah (CMS) arr Bay of Islands 1834 and there had 3 chn: William 1835; Thomas 1837, Sarah Elizabeth 1839)

**Kezia Bedford** arr Oct 1827 (WSM teacher) was briefly engaged to **William Puckey** (CMS). Both CMS & WMS missionaries were concerned by 'this young person's behaviour' and she was dismissed and escorted back to Sydney, where she in Jan1829 (aged 27) she married Lancelot Iredale.

**Rev John Bumby** (Superintendent for WMS) with his sister **Mary Anne Bumby** arr at Mangungu in 1839; Mary Anne hosted the Government officials for the Treaty signing 12<sup>th</sup> Feb 1840 as John was in Australia on mission business; John Bumby was drowned in May 1840. Mary Anne m. **Rev Gideon Smales** (who had also arrived in 1839) Dec 1840. They had 6 children.

**William Wallis**, brother of James arrived at Mangungu in 1836 to work as a missionary but fell from the vessel while he was disembarking and drowned. James' oldest son, born a year later on 29 April 1837, was named William almost certainly in honour of James' brother.

Mehetabel Newman (1822–1908) arrived in New Zealand in 1844 and lived with her sister and brother-in-law, Jane and George Buttle, at Te Kopua, Waipa, south of Auckland. A brother, Joseph, and two other sisters, Elizabeth Fairburn and Ann Atkin, were also living in New Zealand. Mehetabel shared with Jane Buttle the customary women's work at the mission station: teaching Maori girls to read, write and sew; taking Sunday school; helping to run a large household in an efficient manner; nursing the sick; providing hospitality; and seeing to the daily needs and education of the European children. As an unmarried woman she was subject to family criticism and pressure, particularly when

she continued to live with George Buttle and his eight children after he was widowed in 1857. She married George and when he died she married the widowed missionary Rev John Warren

NZ Herald

WARREN - BUTTLE - At Remuera, on April 3 [1878], at the residence of Joseph Newman, Esq., by the Rev. James Wallis, the Rev. John Warren, of Onehunga, to Mehetabel, relict of the late Rev. George Buttle.

James Wallis signed the Treaty of Waitangi 1840, as a witness. In July 1842 the Governor William Hobson and Ensign Best visited the station at Raglan staying with James and Mary for two days. Hobson expressed appreciation of the work.

Samuel Butler (1802-1836) drowned aged 34 and was buried on the 5th December 1836 leaving a wife. Ann Dunn and six children. He was settled at the entrance to the Waima River in 1827. His boat upset getting timber for the Brazil Packet and he was intoxicated at the time. There was a collection taken up for the family and Mrs Butler and her children departed for Sydney on the Nimrod arriving 11th May 1837.

#### Francis White

Francis White arrived in NZ in 1835. He established a prosperous business in the Hokianga district as a timber merchant and built a spacious and, eventually, comfortable home, Mata, about a mile from the Mangungu mission station and stayed there until 1850 then moved to Auckland. Initially the children attended the mission school. Later they were taught at home by a private governess, and they joined in lessons with their cousins, this time under the supervision of their aunt, Eliza White.

#### Other private tutors

**Mr James Buller -** first residence was at Mangungu in the Hokianga, in 1836, where he was a tutor in the family for Rev Nathaniel Turner. (son Walter Lawry Buller b. Kaipara 1838)

**Dr Richard Day** (WMS medical missionary) arr. 1836 – became a tutor to the Hobbs children

Charles Davis, from Australia, was tutor to the Woon children
